

Governor Walker Signs Liability Insurance Bill

April 8, 2016 (Madison, WI)- The Wisconsin Propane Gas Association thanked Governor Walker for signing Assembly Bill 698 into law on March 30, 2016 at the bill signing in the Governor's office.

This law changes the licensure requirements for obtaining a liquefied petroleum gas retailers license from the Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS). Originally the law stated that a propane dealer may prove financial responsibility by obtaining a surety bond, irrevocable letter of credit or liability insurance to get the license. Assembly Bill 698 eliminates the surety bond and irrevocable letter of credit as financial measure that satisfy the license requirement.

"By eliminating a surety bond or letter of credit as an option for obtaining a license, we are strengthening the states' propane industry and keeping safety a top priority," said WPGA Executive Director, Emma Shultz. "Although most propane marketers in the state already carry general commercial liability insurance, this change will standardize that process."
